Recognize Stressors



The effects of more stressors don't simply "add up"... they "multiply" When our energy is depleted stress becomes unmanagable more quickly

> A "perceived" threat is just as much a stressor as a "real" threat

Sometimes even more so because others ignore the stressor or belittle it

Stressors can be different day to day (or from one minute to the next)

Stressors can be hidden or overt

Stressors differ from person to person

> Remember: good stress uses energy too

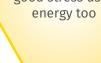


When there is troubling behaviour ask: Why? Why now?
